COURSE OBJECTIVES:

Students will be able to:

- 1. Understand the origins and theological tenets of liberalism from the early 19th century to the present, including its influence on ecumenism and process theology.
- 2. Understand and distinguish reactions to liberalism, including Fundamentalism, Neo-Orthodoxy, and Evangelicalism.
- 3. Understand the historical development and theology of the Holiness Movement, Pentecostalism, and the Charismatic Movement.
- 4. Understand the origins and tenets of Liberation and Contextual theologies.

ASSESSMENTS AND ASSIGNMENTS:

Class performance will be evaluated based upon: (1) class participation (20%); (2) brief thought papers (50%); and a final paper (30%).

<u>This class includes 20 hours of learning</u>—16 hours of Synchronous learning and 4 hours of Asynchronous learning. The synchronous portions of the class will occur via Zoom.

CLASS ATTENDANCE:

Students must not miss more than 20% of class. This is four (4) hours. Students may only miss one two-hour synchronous Zoom session.

CLASS PARTICIPATION:

Participation in class is critical for the success of the learning environment. It is important that each student offer their perspective as informed by careful engagement with the assigned readings. Thoughtful questions, respectful inquiry, sincere discussions and even disagreements will help create a setting in which each of us will learn from each other. Taking notes, completing readings prior to the class sessions and being prepared exchange ideas are necessary to participate appropriately.

WRITTEN WORK:

Two-page thought papers will be submitted <u>based upon five of the twenty chapters</u> covered in the required texts. These thought papers will reflect the student's basic grasp of the overall concept presented in the chapter and the relevance of the concept for the contemporary church. The first paper will be due Sunday, April 19 by 10:00pm. (10 Pages total for this course). A ten-page <u>final</u> paper will be required which will address the question "How would you deconstruct the primary worship service/style at your church and How would a different theological approach be beneficial to your church and the neighborhood surrounding your church?" The final paper should include significant references to the concepts presented in the required, as well as the supplemental resources.

• HONOR CODE & ACADEMIC EXPECTATIONS

Honor Code

All MSCOS students are required to abide by the MSCOS Honor Code, and to seek to uphold the highest standards of academic and pastoral integrity. The MSCOS will use letter grades A, B, C, D, or F. Students must repeat classes graded D or F. The MSCOS sends grade reports to the Division of Ordained Ministry, the annual conference, and the Regional COS Director. In exceptional circumstances, students may request an incomplete for a course by submitting a written request to the instructor and the MSCOS director. Incomplete grades not resolved within 60 days will be recorded as an F.
